Along with this we can also be reminded of the other part of Jesus life and his ministry among us to show us a better way to be, in our attitudes and ways of thinking to help make the families and communities we live in and among places of tolerance and understanding and most importantly of love, expressed in all kinds of different ways. Because after all Jesus purpose and death on the Cross was and is to demonstrate God's love for his creation and us as part of that creation.

May all God's blessings be upon you and your family and friends this Eastertide.



Management Environment Trust Landfill Communities Fund. These reflect the wide local support for the appeal and are very welcome indeed.

# **Bampton Parish Council**

At the recent meeting of the Parish Council it was reported that although the numbers of people using the 111 bus had declined the service was not in immediate danger of withdrawal. If you want this service to remain into the future though you need to use it – 'Use it or Lose it'.

The council has now received permission from the landowner for an extension to the Millennium Footpath towards the Haweswater Beck at Black Bridge to link with the existing riverside path. This project has the support of the Lake District National Park Authority who will dedicate it as a public right of way and will be worked on during this year.

The actions of the Parish Council with regard to ponies on the common were discussed at length. Concerns that the council's reaction had been disproportionate were expressed by members of the public and it was confirmed that no further action will be taken by the council.

Highways are to be asked to add Askham and possibly also Penrith to the newly renovated signpost at Knipe to prevent drivers from continuing straight on to Low Knipe instead of turning through the gate. Signs advising ambulance drivers not to use the Whale road have also been requested and it is hoped that they will be erected at the Askham end of that road. Some concern was also expressed over the signage at the Burnbanks road junction at Naddle Gate.

Richard Carruthers reported that a rowan tree had been planted on Bomby Green in memory of Liz Hall who contributed so much to the council and the village in general. Community Asset Registration forms in relation to village assets had been submitted to EDC after many parishioners backed the move.

The green waste skip that was supplied at the PC's expense should now have been removed and those that come in the next months will be on contract through EDC. There is only one a month between April and October and EDC need to be informed when it is full so please let me know when it is full. Thank you.

It was decided that, in view of the poor attendance at Annual Parish Meetings in recent years, this year the APM would be held on the same evening as the PC meeting on **Tuesday May 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm**. The APM is an opportunity for you to raise matters that concern you and you are all encouraged to come. If you have anything that you want to be raised please let me or Richard know so it can be put on the agenda although it is not necessary to do so. The PC is there to serve the community and this is a chance to hear about its work during the year and find out how your money has been spent. All council minutes, agendas and financial reports are on the village web site.

# Bampton and District Local History Society New beginnings

Your new Committee has been promising that in 2017, there will be familiar items but also some new ideas. I am glad to announce that the society has a new treasurer – Roger Storey – and we appreciate his willingness to take on this vital role.

It was certainly new research into Bampton's past that provided the basis for our meetings in February and March though the topics drew on very different historical sources. It was the 'pain books' ie the rule books of the Thornthwaite Manorial Court that provided much of the evidence for the discussion of how Bamptonians maintained good order in their village during the medieval period. The mystery of the 'iron crowns' on some local signposts, however, had to be pursued by searching the accounts and day books of certain Penrith iron founders and in the correspondence of Bampton Parish Council. I am pleased that Mike Lea, the

speaker on 'iron crowns', has agreed that we can put his presentation on the BDLHS website. I'm sure it will find a ready audience!

Our next meeting is on **Tuesday April 4<sup>th</sup>** and is about 'The Ice Age in the Lowther Valley'. The speaker Joe Cann will be discussing the effects of glaciation on our landscape – no doubt his sources of evidence will be of a different kind altogether! We take a break in May, but make a note in your diary of the 'Bampton Walk' on **June 18<sup>th</sup> from 11.00am**. Together with the Lowther and Askham Local History Society we are planning an historical walk around the ways and byways of Bampton. The walk will be followed by lunch in the Memorial Hall and will be our main social event of the summer. More details about the cost and numbers will follow shortly.

CFR's will not be tasked to attend all 999 calls but will be asked to attend the following type of emergencies: abdominal pain, severe allergic reaction, breathing problems, fitting, diabetic emergency, chest pain, stroke, loss of consciousness, collapse, cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest, some trauma. We will not normally be tasked to any incident involving children under 12.

# The local bus

The number of passengers using the weekly bus from Bampton to Penrith each Thursday has reduced in recent months. Fellrunner has confirmed that their breakeven point is 50% of capacity which is what is currently being achieved. They have also confirmed that they will try to subsidise lesser used routes where possible. So why not get your bus pass out and take advantage of the opportunity to get free transport and help insure the future of the 111 route.

Not old enough for a bus pass? Don't worry, you will be made equally welcome and can help carry the bags.

The bus is run by Fellrunner and operates every **Thursday**. It will leave **Burnbanks at 10.00am**, travelling via **Grange Bridge (10.07am)** and leave **Bampton at 10.14am** to arrive at **Penrith Bus Station at 10.48am**. The return bus will leave **Penrith Bus Station at 1.30pm** to arrive back in **Bampton at 2.02pm** and **Burnbanks at 2.16pm**. For those in the Rosgill area the bus reaches **Rosgill Head around 9.45am** and returns **around 2.30pm**. Fellrunner tell us it is a 'hail and ride' service i.e. the bus will stop if you flag it down. However, it would be better to ring 01768 88232 in advance so the driver has warning. Use it or lose it!
