
BAMPTON PARISH NEWSLETTER AUGUST – SEPTEMBER 2020



Dear Fríends

They think it's all over...it is now..!! Those are the famous words that the football commentator Kenneth Wolstenholme uttered in the final moments of the 1966 world cup final as Geoff Hurst, of England, scored his third and England's fourth goal to seal the victory over West Germany.

They might also have been the words exclaimed by many in the UK as the pandemic, which has dominated our lives in the past few months, potentially comes to an end with many lockdown restrictions eased.

We of course know that it is not the end, but to quote Winston Churchill "Now, this is not the end. It is not even the beginning of the end. But it is, perhaps, the end of the beginning" This quote was made by him during World War II after the battle of El Alamein and General Montgomery's victory over the Afrika Corps in the desert. In other words, even though the situation has been going on for a long time, the situation has changed and there is still a long way to go.

That is true for us as we all adapt to a new and less restrictive way of life. It is a bit 'normal' but not completely as we still have to observe social distancing or if fortunate gather in 'bubbles' or extended groups. Each of us will in our own way make the best of it. However, many will not be able to: through bereavement, particularly families of those who died from Covid19, loss of income or loss of jobs, mental health issues, domestic abuse and others who are vulnerable or slipped

through the social care net. The joy of an eased lockdown may be tempered by these factors and may not be easily resolved or significantly reduced due to the consequences of those circumstances.

Our help, support and prayer are needed at this tricky time, both in general, and for anyone known personally to us in our communities who has or is suffering. For them it will not be over and as the Bishop of Carlisle, Rt Revd James Newcombe reminded us when he preached at our online Zoom service some weeks ago, we must be compassionate as Jesus himself was, in relating to people's lives and situations.

Jesus recognised the spiritual 'lostness' of those around him who were longing for security and meaning in life. Likewise, he responded to people's physical pain and emotional sorrow. He healed and comforted them, giving them hope and continues to do so in this world as we experience all the uncertainties that have surrounded us. Jesus life and teaching taught us much and provides an example of how to live with our neighbours and love one another. But what makes him more than just another good man and teacher with good ideas and philosophy of life, is that Jesus offered a meaning and purpose for our existence, best exemplified in his resurrection from the grave to that glorious hope of eternal life and a deep relationship with our Creator God.

In that resurrection, God through his Son Jesus, showed that his death on the cross was not the end, it wasn't all over as the spectators who ran on the pitch at the very end of the World Cup Final discovered. There was more, another goal, and for us all there is more, and not least as our church buildings have got the green light to open and resume services of worship. For us, that started on the 12th July in the High Westmorland Parishes at St James Tebay, cascading down, to include all the other churches, so that on the 2nd August all our buildings will be open – subject to Risk Assessments being completed. With all preparations made we will be ready, with social distancing and advisory caps on numbers, to receive all members of our communities to join with us in worship.

If however you are not feeling quite comfortable and secure about coming back or attending church for the first time, that is absolutely fine. Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID-19, including people who are aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions. Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household.

Come when it suits and not before. A warm welcome awaits you whenever that might be. There is also the option of joining us online with Zoom Church at 10am for the immediate future. Just email me <u>alunjhurd@gmail.com</u> and I will send you an invite.

In the meantime, may I wish you all good health and all God's blessings as we continue to journey together through this pandemic and with trust in God through to the other side.

Church opening and services

The church is now open for private prayer every Wednesday from 2 - 4pm and on Sunday mornings at 10am for services – these will be shorter than usual and there will not be any singing. In between these two events the church will be closed. In accordance with church guidelines a Covid 19 Risk Assessment has been completed for the church and hygiene measures are in place.

Face Masks

The following guidance has been received from Bishop James:

"Face coverings are currently mandatory on public transport and will be mandatory in shops and in supermarkets from 24^{th} July. People are also encouraged to wear face coverings in enclosed public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as a place of worship." So you will need to bring your own mask from this Sunday onwards although there will be limited supplies available at church. Relevant guidance on face coverings is available on the <u>www.gov.uk</u> website.

Return to Ringing

After an interval of 4 months we are pleased to say that St. Patrick's bells will be ringing again but not like parishioners have become used to hearing. Restrictions due to COVID-19 mean that it will only be possible for 3 of the 6 bells to be rung which will sound different from normal ringing. The restrictions also mean that the total permitted time will be 15 minutes and occasionally may involve the ringing of a single bell.

Bampton Post Office/Shop – questionnaire evaluation results

You may recall a little while ago we asked you to complete a questionnaire telling us what services you value at the shop/post office; asking you for ideas for possible new services which we could pass to the new tenants. I am delighted to say that you did not let us down! We received 40 responses which is about 20% of the community (and we know that some of you replied for the whole household!) So THANK YOU. We captured all your ideas and suggestions and these were passed to Justin and Dan, the new tenants, to consider and, if appropriate, give a try.

The main headlines were probably no surprises. The overwhelming majority of respondents valued the shop and post office and those of you that had not used the services in the past 6 months mainly said this was down to opening times and lack of variety of products. You asked for the shop to be open longer hours and in terms of products you asked for milk, bread, locally produced items, home baking and also beer!

In terms of ideas and suggestions your creative juices flowed and here are some ideas:

- Pop up evening meals was a very popular suggestion
- Using the café for local events for things like coffee morning, breakfasts, knitting groups, book clubs etc was also high on your wish list
- Having a local notice board to share local events/promote local activities along with being able to purchase tickets for local events at the shop was important to a lot of you
- To improve the outside area with more seating

We are delighted that Justin and Dan seem very in tune with these ideas and hopefully many of you have noticed the beautiful new seating area and pots outside, the amazing café menu including home baking.

Now, it is very much back to you all – in order for the shop and Post Office to go from strength to strength and deliver some of the ideas and suggestions you told us you wanted, we need you to support our fantastic local shop and Post Office wherever possible, tell your friends, and make the most of what is on offer on our doorstep. Thank you.

With lockdown easing but COVID 19 still very much 'out and about' Bampton CFR team has not yet been able to resume our monthly training. However, North West Ambulance Service is planning some extra training soon to help teams get back up to speed and I hope this will also signify a return to more normal operations. The team are still available to help people in Bampton and the surrounding area but call outs are down significantly as CFR's are not currently being sent to anyone with suspected coronavirus.

If you think you'd like to join the team and help provide essential emergency cover for the local community please feel free to get in contact with me for an informal chat or look at the NWAS CFR page <u>http://www.nwas-responders.info/</u>

All applications are submitted through the web page and are confidential.

If you feel unwell and think it is a medical emergency DIAL 999 or 112 and ask for AMBULANCE. Any on call CFR's will then be tasked by Ambulance control to attend if appropriate. CFR's will not be tasked to attend all 999 calls but will be asked to attend the following type of emergencies: abdominal pain, severe allergic reaction, breathing problems, fitting, diabetic emergency, chest pain, stroke, loss of consciousness, collapse, cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest, some trauma. We will not normally be tasked to any incident involving children under 12.
