

# Dear Friends

## "The bow of promise above a storm-tossed world"

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble ... nations are in uproar, kingdoms fall; he lifts His voice, the earth melts! The Lord Almighty is with us" (Psalm 46 v 1,6)

Reflecting on the issues of the moment that grab our attention on the news (political turmoil at Westminster, war in Europe in Ukraine, assassinations, unrest, earthquakes, floods, fires, refugees) it seems like a never-ending round of strife and worry. Yet the vast majority of the 8 billion people in the world will have a good, if unremarkable, day. Of course, we live in a blessed country, compared to many, and we live in wonderful Cumbria, where, on a clear day, we can see Blencathra, Cross Fell and beyond! However, even here, there is still trouble and, with rises in the cost of living, a measure of increasing anxiety about what the autumn and winter might bring.

The Psalmist wrote, "God is our refuge and strength; an ever-present help in trouble" – reminding us that we can find and know peace, in these challenging times, though God in Christ.

I recently came across this poem by Catherine James – entitled "Rainbows": Rainbows are not only for the sky,

They lie ... concealed, shimmering in dark places. Autumn ignites trees to fire; seas and sky exchange blue and diamonds glitter on the grass, refracting light into colour. Creator God, who threw the bow of promise above a storm-tossed world, You paint its spectrum into our lives, our passing seasons among their clouds. Help us to see their beauty and find You, too, in the rainbows of each day.

In our lounge we have a painting called "Master of Storms", which depicts Jesus standing next to the mast of the boat, on a turbulent sea, with a dark and brooding sky all around; a parting is glimpsed in the clouds and the first ray of light streams through it on to the figure of Jesus!

The Psalmist writes, "Be still and know that I AM God"

Peter writes in the greeting of his second letter, "Grace and Peace be yours in abundance through the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord".

When navigating our way through this world can sometimes feel like a trip on the Titanic after the iceberg, Peter confidently states that GRACE and PEACE can be ours **in abundance** – not just 'some' peace but 'abundant' peace through our knowledge of God and Jesus our Lord! What a promise!

For me, there are two areas, where we can find that 'knowledge' of God. Firstly, we see creation itself – the beauty, the variety and the splendour of the world in which we live. Secondly, there is that personal knowledge and inner peace that comes from a life transformed by Jesus our Lord when we trust in Him. As the hymn writer puts it, "No guilt in life, no fear in death; this is the power of Christ in me" (from 'In Christ alone').

Peter's greeting first uses the traditional Greek greeting – 'grace', a kind of 'hello'; but for the Christian 'grace' is a word that resonates with the loving forgiveness of God for humans. The second word used is the Hebrew 'shalom' – peace, peace from God in life, in families, in work, in relationships and peace with God.

#### News of an old friend

Some of you will well remember Maureen Cummings, who lived at Gatefoot for a number of years. Whilst she lived here, she was involved in lots of activities in the village and was known for her hearty laugh and kindness.

She was responsible for the running of the Hospice at Lancaster for a number of years then on her retirement, when she could have taken a step back from her commitments, she chose to spend a year with Voluntary Service Overseas, helping to establish palliative care services in Russia. This took her to Siberia; not a choice which many would have made.

She was a member of the PCC for 10 years, taking on the role as a very diligent secretary for a number of those. She was also a very 'hands-on' school governor at Bampton Endowed, bringing to the role her strengths which included positivity, honesty, listening skills and the ability to 'tell it as it was' without causing any offence. She was extremely supportive of staff and pupils, especially when rapidly changing government initiatives needed to be implemented. She took a particular interest in the teaching of Maths, undergoing several courses of training in the latest methods.

Maureen loved Bampton and its community. Indeed one of her twin daughters was married in St. Patrick's Church and her son Laurence, a renowned international organist, played in the church on a number of occasions.

After moving to St. Albans and subsequently to London to be near her family, Maureen kept in touch with a number of Bampton residents. She died at her home in the middle of July after a short illness and will be greatly missed by many.

## **Bampton REMOTE Cinema New Season**

It's cool to be back for another season of films! We kick off on:

<u>Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> September</u>: *The Duke* (12A, 2020 95minutes): This film is a moving true story that celebrates a man who was determined to live a meaningful life. Set in 1961, it follows the story of Kempton Bunton, a 60 year old Newcastle taxi driver who stole Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington. Jim Broadbent and Helen Mirren make it a class act.

Tickets will be on sale at Bampton Post Office and Shop from Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> August to Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> September if you wish supper + film; tickets are on sale at the door on the night for film only as usual. It's useful to have a contact list for those buying a supper ticket plus film so we will continue to record that. If you wish a vegetarian option that can be recorded then too.

Cinema dates from then on will continue to be on the third Saturday of every month (except December and January) as follows: October 15<sup>th</sup>; November 19<sup>th</sup>; December 10<sup>th</sup>; January 14<sup>th</sup>; February 18<sup>th</sup>; March 18<sup>th</sup> and April 15<sup>th</sup>. Film titles will be given in the October/November newsletter for the autumn/winter season.

We have had to increase the price of tickets for supper plus film as follows:

Adult meal + film: £12; U16 meal + film: £9. Film tickets remain the same price, adult: £5; U16:£2. Abbott Lodge ices will continue to be sold at £1:50 at the short interval. As always there is the bar, courtesy of the Village Hall, with the finest wines known to humanity, beers and soft drinks. Supper is served at 6pm and the film starts at 7:30pm (December 10<sup>th</sup> film will be a family friendly matinee with no meal; time to be decided).

We're really looking forward to sharing our eleventh year of Bampton Cinema with you. See you there!

#### The Heat Fund from Fuel Bank Foundation

The Heat Fund provides fuel to households who live off the gas grid, rely on bulk fuel deliveries and are unable to keep warm this winter. The scheme helps prevent self-disconnection where a household cannot afford to pay for their fuel and has been deemed as in 'crisis need' by Fuel Bank Partners. The Heat Fund ensures that people are not left without energy for basics like heating and hot water.

If you rely on oil, LPG, coal etc and cannot afford fuel, the Citizens Advice Energy Team can help with completion of an application to The Heat Fund – max £500 and amongst other criteria you will need to produce a bank statement. You can contact the local Citizens Advice on 03300 563037.

## The Bampton Endowed Schools Endowment

This is just a reminder that the closing date for applications for an educational grant this year is 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

## **Bampton Valley Community Pub**

As most will be aware, The Mardale Inn reopened on July 1<sup>st</sup>. The refurbishment of the bar area that happened in May and June demonstrated outstanding support from the Valley with many volunteering their time to get it ready on time. It's been really rewarding since to see so many of our local community visiting and to hear positive comments on the work done to date.

While the bar area only is open currently, we are delighted to be able to move onto the next phase of refurbishment as the Prince's Countryside Fund has recently confirmed a £23,000 grant to fund a new kitchen.

Our bid was based on The Mardale Inn kitchen being a place in the Valley where on-demand evening meals would again be available. This is important for tourism income, e.g. for visitors to accommodation such as Bampton Village Shop, but also for permanent residents who may live on their own and would appreciate a local place to meet and eat with friends. We don't expect food to be available until October but are aiming for The Mardale Inn kitchen to then be another great example of the outstanding work that the Prince's Countryside Fund does to empower family farms and rural communities to ensure their future.

## **Bampton Village Shop**



#### Post Office

Unfortunately, this week, the Post Office has decided to close Bampton Branch. For us this was an essential part of the service we provided to support the community and I operated the Post Office every day, rather than restricting the hours because it was an essential service and for some a vital link. I and the community have worked tirelessly to support its

development and growth over the last two years and I am sure that I am not alone in being deeply saddened by this move. A replacement service will be announced soon, and an update circulated with further information.

### Shop

Without vital local support, the Café and Village Shop also face a similar uncertain future. Primarily the services we provide solely benefit our immediate community, then secondly visitors and tourists alike. Our primary focus is and remains to serve the community. We work hard to provide products of quality and offer value for money. It saddens us greatly not to see more of you using the shop and the facilities it has to offer. It is open to all, and everyone is welcome.

When we came in June 2020, the Country was being ravaged by the start of COVID-19 and we supported many of the most vulnerable in the area who were self-isolating, by providing groceries along with moral support.

The Bampton Trust performed a survey analysing a broad spectrum of the local community. This survey looked at the wants and needs of the residents in the area specifically looking at what they wanted in a village shop. With these findings in mind, we set about taking steps to address these requests and actualising them. We developed the shop; opened a Café and updated the services in direct response to the feedback.

As the business is struggling we desperately need community support. But as part of this we want your feedback and opinions. If you are interested and would like to take part, we will shortly conduct a survey of our own which will be available online and from the shop. The results of this survey will be published in the parish newsletter.

As always, we have a debt of gratitude to those who support the shop and cafe. But a huge thank you to all who used and supported the Post Office.

If you feel unwell and think it is a medical emergency DIAL 999 or 112 and ask for AMBULANCE. Any on call CFR's will then be tasked by Ambulance control to attend if appropriate. CFR's will not be tasked to attend all 999 calls but will be asked to attend the following type of emergencies: abdominal pain, severe allergic reaction, breathing problems, fitting, diabetic emergency, chest pain, stroke, loss of consciousness, collapse, cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest, some trauma. We will not normally be tasked to any incident involving children under 12.
