# Hello,

I am the new Church of England minister for North Westmorland, an area embracing Shap, Bampton, Askham, Lowther, Brougham, Clifton and Brougham, Cliburn, Bolton, Morland and Crosby Ravensworth (with apologies to the churches and localities within that circle that I haven't mentioned – you are not forgotten!). I am also acting as Rural Dean, with responsibility for Appleby Deanery, including Appleby itself, and the wider area down to Brough, Kirkby Stephen, Orton and Tebay. I hope you will excuse me using this month's article just to introduce myself and my family.

I have come here from the south west of the County, around the top of the Duddon Estuary. I had responsibility for seven churches there, and for a year I was also the interim Methodist Minister. I have moved with my wife, Charlotte, and daughter Anna, who is on a gap year before university. We have a son, William, who lives in Hertfordshire in one of our former parishes. He works as a planter, machine operator and HGV driver for a large tree nursery.

Charlotte and I met at university, where we both studied law. Charlotte practised as a solicitor before leaving work to look after our two children. I was a barrister for 20 years, first in independent practice and then helping to set up a London litigation practice for a US law firm. In my early days, I practised in charity, company and insolvency law, but gradually moved into commercial IT,

construction and technology projects, including spacecraft (not as exciting as it sounds, unfortunately). In my spare time, I enjoy fiddling with my trusty Land Rover, which has been with me for nearly 15 years now, and is back from the dead, having been written off by a careless motorist while parked during my ordination service.

I gradually reduced the amount of legal work I was doing, to give me more time for church commitments. After completing my ministerial training, I was curate of two rural parishes in Hertfordshire. Having worn many volunteer hats, I never forget that the life of any community (the church included) depends upon the time and efforts of its unpaid army of volunteers.

Charlotte retrained as a primary school teacher when our daughter started school. She was headteacher of a small school in Hertfordshire, and is now Director of Education for the Diocese of Carlisle, supporting our family of 104 church schools. I have been involved in church and community school governance, from pre-school to Key Stage 5, for about 16 years now, so I look forward to helping all the schools in my new patch, as well as getting involved in youth work.

With such a large area to cover, it is impossible for the vicar to do everything, or even to know everything that he or she ought to be doing. I am hugely blessed to have the support of (and to support in my turn) a large team of ministers and other volunteers across all our churches. Please do not hesitate to get in touch, for any reason, using the contact details below. I hope over time to get to know, and to be of service, to everyone, churchgoer or not. Please stop me in the street, outside school, in the shops or in the pub and introduce yourself. You will recognise me when I am dressed in black with a funny collar, but I am the vicar in my shorts and t-shirt too.

# Rainfall 2022 - Mill Craggs - Bampton - A Very Average Year?

For the past 30 years I have been keeping rainfall records for Mill Craggs and the total of 1,542mm (60.7ins) for the year was only 1.25% over the 30 year average.

However, the monthly average ranged between 36% in January to 202% in February, with 8 months having below average rainfall.

The year started wet, windy and mild and there followed nearly 3 weeks of ante cyclonic dry days and chilly nights concluding with Storms Malik and Corrie. Desmond, Eunice, Franklin and Gladys followed in February and only 4 days when there was no rain. A mild month when only 2 days had below 0c temperatures. March was another mild month with the temperature peaking at over 20c on the 26<sup>th</sup> during a 10 day dry spell.

April was another below average rainfall month, with frosts. Similarly in May with no frosts, unusually. June redressed the rainfall shortfall and generally did not live up to its tag of "Flaming". But July and August certainly were and exceptionally hot days were experienced from 9<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> of August, compensated by 25mm of rain from 18<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup>. September climaxed on 30<sup>th</sup> with 40mm of rain after the first ground frost was experienced on 17<sup>th</sup>, but not registered on thermometer. The third quarter was the 4<sup>th</sup> driest of the recording period but wetter than 2021.

The autumn quarter was wet and mild except for a chilly snap at end of November to 16<sup>th</sup> December – a year low temperature of -10.8c was recorded on 15<sup>th</sup>, a 5 year minimum.

So averages can be misleading and we don't seem to be suffering from lack of rainfall overall, just at the wrong time?

What will 2023 bring? To date RAIN, 188mm as I type, already in excess of the average for January and 60% of January 1999 the wettest January recorded so far.

Forecast is for rain or snow every day for next fortnight at least. Odds on 300mm+.

# **Bampton & District Local History Society**

The 2022/2023 season of meetings of the Bampton & District Local History Society (BDLHS), continued on 10th January with a talk by Mrs. Jean Jackson on Shap Abbey, its history, and association with Bampton, Shap and the local area. The next meeting of the BDLHS is to be held in the Bampton Memorial Hall at **2pm** on **Tuesday** 7<sup>th</sup> **February**, and the speaker is Dr. William D. Shannon M.A., PhD. The subject of his talk is "Cumbria & the Jacobites". This will include references to the 1715 and 1745 rebellions, and the last battle on English soil at nearby Clifton. #### **The Bampton Trust Update**

As you will know, Justin and Dan are giving up the tenancy on the shop and tearoom at the end of February. We are sorry to see them go and wish them well in whatever they decide to do next.

Our recent survey showed that the shop is an important part of the village and we would be very reluctant to lose this asset. We have explored the options available and reflected upon past experiences and are working towards an agreement that will hopefully keep the shop open.

We are talking with the Management Committee of Bampton Valley Community Pub (BVCP) and exploring a model where they would manage the B&B rooms together with the pub's own letting rooms. They would then sublet the shop out on a reduced rent to a commercial partner who would run that side of the business. As you will see from the article below, they are in negotiations with the owners of Askham Stores and we are all optimistic that this partnership will succeed.

The Trust and BVCP have always believed that the pub and the shop can work together for the good of the community. Through this new partnership, we are optimistic that the Valley can now retain a village shop, letting rooms and a pub for the long term.

#### **Bampton Valley Community Pub (BVCP) Update**

The Valley's community owned pub, The Mardale Inn in Bampton, is building on its success from 2022 and extending its kitchen opening hours.

On Fridays and Saturdays, the kitchen is now open from noon offering light lunches. All other food serving times remain the same as **Wednesday to Saturday** evenings from **5pm to 8pm** and **Sunday** lunch from **noon to 4pm**.

On **Fridays until the end of March** and to help folks get out during the dark days of winter, we will be hosting 'Bampton Valley Seniors Winter Friday Lunches'. This enables anybody who is over 65 and living in the Valley to enjoy a 20% discount on their food and drink between **noon and 2pm**. There is a pick up and drop off car service provided by volunteers for the Bampton Valley villages. Please call the pub on 719202 between 11.30am and noon on Friday.

The Mardale continues to host a number of events including the first pub quiz of the year on **Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> January** at **6pm** for an hour or so. Come with a team of up to 6 or join a table. £2/head to enter with a new format on the prizes.

On Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> February, our first charity music gig of 2023 is with 'Stivvy & The Wilk' at 5.30pm for 90 minutes. Funds are being raised for Every Life Matters and Annie Mawson's Sunbeams Music Trust. All latest event details and (kitchen) opening hours are listed online at www.themardaleinn.com

Finally, you will have read the previous article from Bampton Trust about the village shop in Norbrock House. In our planning at BVCP, we have always believed that the pub and the shop should be very complementary in supporting the community.

With the tenancy becoming vacant at the shop, we are now exploring the possibility of BVCP taking responsibility for the letting rooms at Norbrock House and partnering with the owners of Askham Stores to extend their shop business into Bampton Valley. The 'Norbrock Annex' would be run as an addition to the four letting rooms being refurbished in The Mardale.

The format of the new shop, Bampton Valley Stores, would be similar to Askham Stores but on a smaller scale. It would offer general groceries, including fresh fruit and veg, meat from Cranstons and The Chopping Block in Penrith, fresh milk from the Abbott Lodge Jersey Farm in Clifton, and a Friday delivery of fresh bread from More? Bakery in Staveley. Newspapers and magazines would be stocked, as well as a range of locally made gifts and cards. There would also be a small cafe area serving tea, coffee, cakes, hot pies and sandwiches to eat in or take away.

There is a lot of further planning to undertake but we are optimistic that partnering with the Trust and James & the team from Askham, we can jointly develop the pub and shop as strong community assets for the Valley.

We will not normally be tasked to any incident involving children under 12.

# Extracts from '100 Years Ago' in the Herald – January & February 1923

Stormy mid February, otherwise all as usual for weather.

Big funeral at Shap, 2.30pm 1<sup>st</sup> January, with several wreaths from Bampton, for George Hall, 17, only son of George and Mary Margaret Hall, Hegdale. He died on 28<sup>th</sup> December. He was well-known in Bampton, Rosgill, Shap etc. His family has been at Hegdale for years.

Married at Askham Church, 10<sup>th</sup> January, John, elder son of Mr. & Mrs. W. Routledge, Ash Hill, Rosgill, to Mary Louisa, only daughter of Mr. & Mrs. J.S. Branthwaite, Helton.

Lord Lonsdale has now (report  $10^{th}$  February, P 1) sold Manchester Corporation the lands for the gathering-ground for its new Haweswater Reservoir for £175,000; rent-roll of these is £2,700 p.a. (£1 then - £80 now).

The Shap and Bampton Reading Rooms' Whist Match was "won by the Bamptonians again", Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup>, at Shap. Dinner after and concert.

A visitor from a Lancashire city went to the Bampton School Concert, and was amazed at how well run it was. (Report 17<sup>th</sup> February, P 3).
