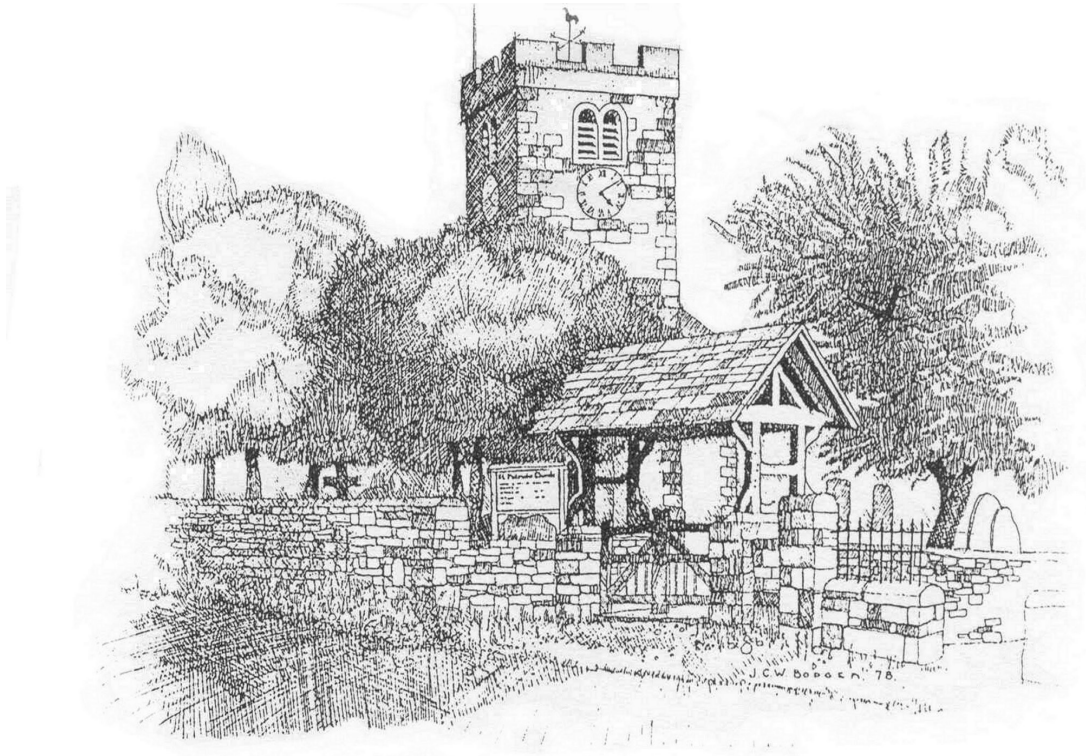


# Bampton Parish Newsletter June - July 2016

## **Church Bells**

The proposal to install a new peal of six bells was outlined in the April/ May issue of the Parish Newsletter. Bampton Parochial Church Council (PCC) have now received all the estimates for work required to install new bells in the church tower, and the preservation of the existing set of five bells. The structural survey of the church tower confirmed that the proposed new ring of bells can be safely hung for full circle ringing without any adverse effects occurring on the tower structure. The PCC will now proceed with an application to the Diocesan Advisory Committee for the installation of a new set of six bells. The historic 18th century bells and their original frame will be retained and preserved to chime out the quarters and hours for the clock. If the

application is successful an appeal for financial support will be launched in the Autumn.

### **THE BAMPTON ENDOWED SCHOOLS ENDOWMENT**

Last year the Charity made 10 grants totalling £2,500 to local young people. These awards were mainly to help them financially while they took part in a variety of post-secondary school courses at college or university.

The Trustees now invite applications for financial support from those who will be undertaking courses at any University, college or institution of higher or further education in autumn 2016. Consideration will also be given to applications from those who will be taking part in other forms of education (including the study of music or other arts) to prepare for entry into any occupation, trade or profession.

To be eligible the applicant must be:

- Under the age of 25 on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2016
- Resident in the civil parish of Bampton, Cumbria or to have attended Bampton Endowed School.

## **Wildflowers on Bomby Green**

As usual the green is looking at its best with plenty of flowers especially along the river edge. Campion, wood anemone and jack-by-the-hedge are flowering just now. Lady's Smock, also known as Cuckoo Flower or even Mayflower, (which indicates when to look for it) can be seen providing food for orange tip butterflies. The snowdrops were lovely earlier on, despite the winter floods. Willing helpers in the autumn helped to make this possible by keeping the rougher growth under control.

We have had an offer from a group of Scouts staying for a week's camp in July to help further. With their help we hope to create an area of shorter grass near the river bank where people can picnic. In keeping with the rest of the green, this will be a very natural looking space – no signs, no picnic tables and no waste bins.

We were concerned about the state of the bridge wall but this has been taken in hand by the Parish Council and Highways.

### **Bampton and District Local History Society Summer 2016**

First thought to report on our April meeting, where Alan Clowes came to speak on the home of Quakerism in Cumbria. He stressed the anti-establishment, anti-Catholic beliefs of groups like the Westmorland Seekers, who were particularly numerous in Kirkby Stephen in the late seventeenth century. George Fox, founder of the Quaker movement, attracted an audience of 1000 people when he preached on Firbank Fell in 1652. In our own parish, we know that families like the Braidleys, who lived at Low Knipe, were very early converts to Quakerism and paid the penalty for failing to attend the established church through frequent fines. We are very grateful to Alan for opening up this topic which we have wanted to include in our programme for a long time.

Two features of the BDLHS programme which are greatly enjoyed by members as well as other friends and relations are our summer visit – this year to Vaugh Steil courtesy of Catherine Lacey – and the summer party – this year on **Tuesday, July 5<sup>th</sup>** at Nick and Lizzie Lindwall's in Rosgill. As we historians know 'Time and Tide wait for No Man' and we are planning some innovations

Please pop in and familiarise yourself with the defibrillator and have a 'go' with a defibrillator trainer. A CPR training dummy will also be available if you want to try doing chest compressions. Hope to see you there. The defibrillator is now registered with the ambulance service who will also be able to advise on first aid. Always call 999 for an ambulance in a medical emergency!

Furthermore, homes in Cumbria are receiving hoax phone calls from HMRC (Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs). Do not divulge personal or bank details. People in Eden are also receiving calls from individuals purporting to be a council officer, claiming to offer home improvement services funded through flood recovery money.
