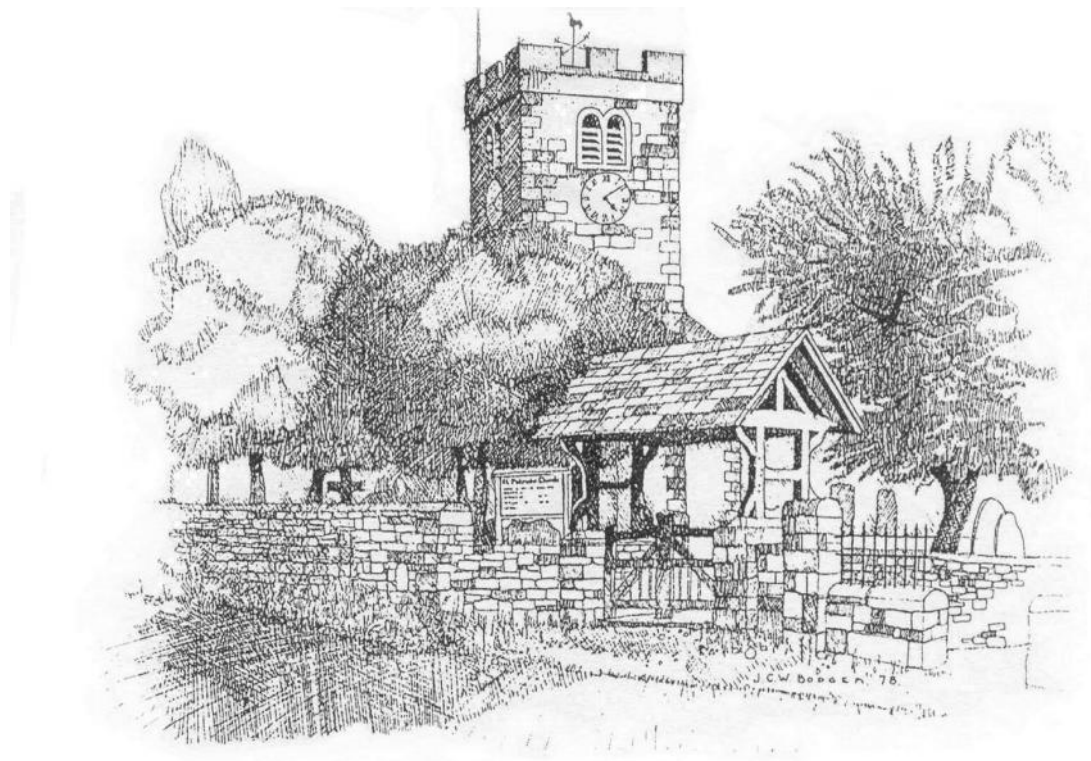


BAMPTON PARISH NEWSLETTER OCTOBER – NOVEMBER 2015



Dear Friends

My parents were regular church goers and my two brothers and I naturally followed. Although I did not consciously have a relationship with God, I always left the evening service in Oxford with an overwhelming sense of peace and 'wellbeing', in spite of the prospect of school the following day!

On my 19th birthday, I started my training as a police officer with Thames Valley Police. I remained in the police for thirty years, during which time I had many interesting experiences.

I think it is fair to say that God helped and guided me hugely through this (main) period of my working life, but of course I was too busy, too wrapped up in work, friendships etc. to notice. Alison and I moved from Berkshire to Cumbria in 1996 and bought a house in Sedbergh. I attended St. Andrews there, rather intermittently, and then in December 2009, on the day it started seriously snowing with a vengeance, we moved to Gaisgill.

It was natural to decide then on a church to attend and I quickly decided on All Saints at Orton. The church goers at Orton quickly accepted me and I felt at home in the community there. I also became more aware of God's influence and began, slowly, to realise that He is always there, in the background. Hold

that thought! I was also influenced, not only by our vicar, Beverley, with her wonderfully enthusiastic zest for ‘the church’, God’s Church, but all the other people playing important parts, for instance Sandra, Chris and Ian. Anyway, Beverley was running a course, entitled ‘Called to Serve’, and thought it would be good for me, so I decided to give it a go. I did, though, explain to her that it was purely for selfish reasons, as I wished to examine my own faith. The course runs from September to July, the groups meeting roughly every fortnight, with breaks at Christmas and Easter. The subject matter is of interest to all and includes examining our faith, how we put this into practise and also what gifts God has given us and how we use them. There is not enough space here to give a more complete list of everything covered. Differing views from course members invariably make for fascinating discussions. The course was the best thing I have ever done, spiritually. Having completed it, I then acted as a group leader for the next course – for me, it was the natural progression of my journey. I learned a lot about my faith, with input from the other people in the groups. It was wonderful to read feedback at the course conclusion; that each person had found the course changed, positively, their spiritual life, in a different way for each person!

As for me and my journey – remember that thought to hold? I learned many things, and continue to learn, but the single most important thing I learned is that God is not in the background but there, in front, leading me, influencing me, loving me. Until I experienced ‘Called to Serve’, I was just too ‘busy’ to notice.

Tinclar's Library

The excursion to St. Mary's Church, Wreay on 19th August was a great success. About a dozen of us gathered at the Plough Inn for lunch, and were then shown round the church by Mrs. Whittaker, a former teacher at Shap School, who gave a masterly talk which took in not only the features of the church itself and its contents but also the life history of Sarah Losh, the founder of the church in 1842, and family and social connections extending as far as the battle of Waterloo and the first Afghanistan war in 1842. If any reader wishes to visit the church they will find it open between the hours of 10am and 4pm.

Acquisition – The trustees have purchased a dossier of the Swindale Grammar School (a registered charity) covering the period 1908 – 1934. It shows that in 1909 the stipend of the Mistress of the school, Annie Harrison, was £30 a year. In 1916 the Mistress was Mary Routledge. Other outgoings were Poor Rate of 2/3d and Fire and Employer's Liability insurances of 11/-. The school closed in 1919 and the main outgoing of the charity thereafter was £25 a year for driving children from Swindale Head to Rosgill School. Annual income came from rentcharges totalling £25 payable by the Earl of Lonsdale on properties in Shap and Crosby Ravensworth. The Trustees are grateful to Yvonne Grundy for introducing us to this opportunity.

Bampton Community First Responders

Members of the CFR team have to undergo an annual assessment of their knowledge and practical skills, carried out by the North West Ambulance Service. This year's assessment has just taken place and all the team members passed with excellent results. The team attends a monthly training evening and, in addition to going through a number of specific scenarios, receives training in the management of specific conditions such as diabetes, asthma and infection prevention and control.

In addition to our Team Leader, Christine Hill, the Bampton Responders are Pat and John Garside, Keith Hill, Judy and Paul Johnson, Alison Jones and Ruth Walters.

Remember, if you feel unwell and think it is a medical emergency DIAL 999 or 112 and ask for AMBULANCE. Any on call CFR's will then be asked by Ambulance control to attend if appropriate.

You may have noticed that the container for the plastic recycling is no longer at the Hall. This facility has now been withdrawn by Eden District Council. However, other recycling (bottles, tins, paper etc.) has not been affected and will continue as normal. In future, all plastic bags and wrapping should be disposed of in your normal household waste (blue bag) with plastic bottles being recycled in the green bags via the fortnightly kerbside collection. Those people who have not been issued with green bags can obtain them by ringing Rebecca, Customer Services Officer at EDC on 01768 817817. At that time they should ascertain from where their recycling will be collected – either outside their property or at a nearby local collection point.

On no account should any plastic recycling be left at the Hall with immediate effect.

Keeping Bomby Tidy

After a fine growing season, Bomby Green has had its annual trim. Thanks to Carl for not only cutting the grass but taking away the mowings. The committee and willing helpers have also had a couple of sessions, making sure the ditch is kept clear in case it's needed to take away flood water, reducing the wilder growth near the bridge and continuing the struggle with the tussocky grass on the west side of the road. The condition of the grass here is a reminder of what much of the green was like before we began to cut it once a year. The false oat grass builds up hummocks of woody stems which make it impossible for less coarse plants to come through and treacherous to walk across. If the autumn is kind to us we plan one more strimming session on **Saturday October 17th** for just 2 hours from **10.30am**. If you feel you could help with the raking up, please come along.

Sadly not many people came along to the coffee morning, talk and treasure hunt but we were happy to see some of the valley's new residents, two of whom took off the treasure after completing the questionnaire which enabled them to look closely at Grange and the area around the green.

A word about the first two films:

'71 is the title of a recent film by director Yann Demange about the reality of Belfast's streets for a young recruit to the British Army, Gary Hook, back in 1971. It's a story, but there's nothing fictional about the sectarian conflicts, the shootings and bombings which characterised life in this city (and elsewhere) during The Troubles. Gary is accidentally left behind by his unit following a street riot. He has to survive the night and return to the safety of his barracks. Jack O'Connell won a rising star award at the recent BAFTAs for his central role in this film.

Withnail and I is a much loved classic (well, maybe not by everyone!). But what's not to like about the settings: Bampton, Haweswater and Sleddale Hall to name a few. In fact, Bampton is a byword for this film. The cast features acting at its best from the late great Richard Griffiths, uncle to *Withnail* and Harry Potter, Richard E. Grant and Peter McGann. It's sassy, full of memorable quotes and the soundtrack is essential 1960s. The story is two flatmates heading away from the pressures of London life for the peace of the countryside but they simply exchange their urban problems for rural ones. Time for change is in the air.

The venue is Bampton Memorial Hall, **doors opening at 7pm**. Tickets are on sale at the door on the night, price **£4 adults; £2 U16**. Bampton Parish Council

At the recent meeting of the Parish Council Mike Slee, EDC councillor, spoke about the possible devolution of some discretionary services to parish councils. For Bampton this could mean that the parish council could provide footway lighting instead of it being done by EDC. Something to be considered in future when the existing lights begin to fail! Mr Slee was also questioned about the unexpected removal of the plastics waste cage. As Bampton is an EDC Bring Site this facility should not have been removed without notice and Mr Slee would investigate the situation as a matter of urgency. In the absence of the cage you are reminded that flytipping is an offence as well as being an eyesore. You may have noticed that some repair work has been done at the parking place by Grange Bridge. This is just a temporary repair and Highways are willing to properly grade and tarmac the area, with some financial contribution from the PC. In view of previous controversy over this area the PC would welcome comments from you before the work is approved. If you have views about this would you please contact Richard Carruthers, PC Chairman, before October 10th. It would only include the current gravelly rough area, not extend any further along the road.

Overgrown hedges and saplings along the verges had been reported to Highways for action and the relevant landowners/tenants would also be contacted. Hedges along roads are the responsibility of farmers rather than wholly Highways. The Keep Left sign at the Burnbanks road end had been removed because there was insufficient support for its retention from local residents when Highways sought their opinion. The old finger post from there will be passed on to History Society as an interesting artefact.

Meetings will be arranged in the fairly near future to discuss with Eden Rivers Trust and other relevant bodies a scheme to improve the banks of the River Lowther. Temporary shoring up work has been done where the bank was dangerously eroded.

There is a casual vacancy on the council because Mike Jones had to resign when he moved away from the parish. Are you interested in becoming a councillor? If you are please contact Richard Carruthers or me as soon as possible so co-option can be done at the next meeting on **Tuesday November 17th**.

All parishioners are most welcome at all PC meetings. Come along and find out what your councillors are doing for the parish.
