

Dear Friends

By the time you read this we will be a whole month into 2016. However I hope it is not too late to wish you 'Happy New Year.' 2016 promises to be a year of change internationally and locally – nothing new there then! Change is such an important part of our lives and in fact, as I have often reminded my students, when you stop facing change it is because you are dead! This goes for our corporate lives just as much as for our personal lives. We know that our children and grandchildren are constantly changing, growing, developing, being equipped for new challenges and new ways of doing things. If they stopped doing this we would quite rightly be worried as it would mean that something was very wrong and their ability to function successfully as adults would be seriously impaired.

In our parishes we are seeing some changes in the way we organise ourselves as we move to new 'Ecumenical Mission Communities'. The churches and chapels of our area will move to appoint local Congregational Leaders to take more responsibility for the way they run the day to day activities. Meanwhile the clergy will spend more of their time offering support and input to people in the community and being involved in new community initiatives that are of use to the whole community including, but not exclusively, those who come to church

regularly. I know that the caring people will still be looking after the needs of the community – some things do not change.

I am encouraged that this area has so much potential for this growth and development. There are such wonderful people here who help and support each other in so many ways. The recent pulling together of the community during the flooding is illustrative of how strong the community spirit is. Caring and supporting the spiritual needs of the area is part of this community attitude and I am really looking forward to hearing how this develops in High Westmorland.

However, change is coming for me and my husband Brian as we move to new parishes at the end of February. We have been here for seven and a half years – although it does not seem like it. Our last Sunday service, therefore, will be **10.30am on 21**st **February at St. Michael's Church Shap**. This will be followed by a 'Bring and Share' lunch in the Memorial Hall and I do hope as many of you as possible will join us.

We will be very sorry to leave this beautiful area and the even more wonderful people. However change is part of life and I feel God has called us to help prepare the people of the Loughrigg Partnership (Ambleside, Brathay and Loughrigg communities) to move to Mission Communities. I am very grateful for the way that the people of this area have let me minister to them. You have taught me so much which I hope I can take into the new post. I know that a new person with new ideas can take things forward here as there is such a rich resource of special people to make it work.

So, the New Year means new changes – but the fundamentals are the same. People loving and watching out for others and a God who loves us so much he was prepared to come in human form to show us that while human bodies change, and the way we organise ourselves to serve each other changes, God's love that is stronger than death is the same today, tomorrow and forever.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) has established a sub-committee to consider the state and condition of the existing bells in the light of recent concerns and the surge of interest from a local team of enthusiasts, and to see what improvements can be recommended. It is known that the bells date from the early 18th century and are suspended from an original oak bell frame. For at least the last twenty years it has only been possible for the bells to be "chimed", rather than "rung up", due to concerns for the integrity of the frame fixings and the tower.

Traffic disruptions

Before Christmas a notice appeared in the Herald about road works in the village but unfortunately it coincided with the weekend of 'the great flood' and so the edition did not reach Bampton Post Office.

A four day temporary road closure is to be imposed in the village from 8th **February** while work is carried out to a 40m stretch of the C3043 near The Mews, Bampton in the vicinity of the telephone exchange. Diversion notices will be set up. Residents will still be able to access both sides of the village during the closure as a route for pedestrians and dismounted cyclists will be maintained.

Bampton Parish Council

Councillors began the January meeting of the Parish Council with a minute's silence to respect the memory of Liz Hall who served the council and community for so many years. She will be sadly missed for her wisdom and commitment to the service of Bampton.

Before the meeting proper John Turner, representing the Fieldbarns Trust, gave a short presentation on its plans to bring disused field barns into use as holiday accommodation by inserting self contained pods into the structures. Several barns in the Rosgill area have been identified as the best sites for this project.

Vicky Haddock was co-opted to the council to fill the vacancy left by Liz Hall's death so there are now 7 councillors again.

Concerns were raised about dog walkers who stray from footpaths and walk through fields where there is no public right of way, sometimes leaving gates open and thus allowing animals to escape. Please remember to shut gates and only use proper signed footpaths when you are walking. The Right to Roam does not apply to all land around the village! Also please do remember to clean up after your dogs when in the village.

The Council agreed to contribute to the cost of the resurfacing and consolidation of the parking area by Grange Bridge which Highways will carry out. An application to the LDNPA Sustainability Fund for a grant for part of this has been made.

The recent very bad weather has meant that Eden Rivers Trust has not yet been able to carry out consultation meetings to discuss future work on the River Lowther which may have some effect on flooding in the future. Anyone who was flooded this time should have had information about grants and other assistance available from both EDC and CCC. It has been noticed that there are still sandbags in the road in some places and these should be returned to where they came from to avoid potential spillage of sand into drains. It is hoped that eventually all the road problems will be remedied but it was pointed out that Highways are extremely overstretched and under budgeted at present. Some

repairs done earlier are now needing to be done again as the rain has washed out the patching!

The next meeting of the Council will be on **Tuesday March 22nd** and all parishioners are welcome to attend. You are reminded that if you have any matters that you think should be discussed at a meeting you can contact any councillor. They are there to serve the parish.

Rainfall 2015 Mill Craggs Bampton – A Wet Year.

Following on the item in the Bampton Parish Newsletter, February – March 2015, I thought readers might be interested in the data for the past year which was probably the wettest in living memory.

December will be the month that will be remembered, very wet but very mild – more than 27 inches of rain falling but day time temperatures as high as 12c. This followed on a November which in itself was nearly twice the average. In fact over 1,000mm (40 inches) fell in these 2 months – no wonder there were floods!

However, September and October were very dry with only 50% of average. Water levels in Haweswater were very low, so Storm Desmond wasn't as devastating for Bampton as it was for others in Cumbria. Haweswater only started to "spill over" later in December when kite surfing was seen on a field near the Black Bridge. Only 20 years ago in 1995 the total rainfall for December was only 35mm, just over 1 inch!

The year started with chilly nights and much colder but drier than 2014. There were only 4 months where sub-zero temperatures were not recorded, but the mild wet air of November and December kept temperatures from dropping as low as usual. The summer... what summer? What will 2016 bring? Already a mixed bag, but rainfall below average!

Voluntary Car Scheme

From 3rd January to 31st December 2015 we had 108 voluntary car runs. Although I will continue as the Car Scheme Co-ordinator I am now too old to be a voluntary driver.
