Dear Friends Collared by God

I was talking with my hairdresser recently about plans for my upcoming ordination and all the things that had yet to be done like the legal paperwork I have to fill in, the first and second fitting of vestments and the invites I need to send out for family, etc. He was quite surprised and remarked that it sounded more like I was planning for a wedding!

In actual fact that is a rather good analogy, especially as I will also have to make vows of allegiance to the Sovereign and of canonical obedience to the Bishop!

But more than that, I'm making a solemn commitment to God himself to a 'life of visible self-giving' as the ordination service words it. Instead of the giving and receiving of rings the symbol I will wear is, of course, the clergy collar and I will receive the honorary title of Reverend to replace my current one as Mrs Fran Parkinson.

And if all this sounds seriously significant, believe me when I say, I'm feeling it!!

I was reading recently that ordination is a 'holy' calling, and that's a word which makes me nervous as it speaks of saintliness and, if you know anything about my story, you'd know that 'saint' is not a word that would be on my CV!

When God first called my name, at the age of 19, I was a teenager determined to seek out my own life in the world and very soon found myself in a bit of a mess. What I hadn't bargained for was that all the while God was seeking me, and the encounter

we had back then changed my whole thinking about the grace and love of God. The journey from there to here hasn't been free of troubles either, or further mistakes that I have might have made, but I've realised along the way that the Greek term for holiness, *hagios*, speaks of so much more than being set apart to be 'holy'. It's God's invitation, not just to be good, but to be his.

The grace of God invites me, in all my frailty and weakness, to walk the journey of holiness with him by my side. As one of Paul's letters expresses it, 'God has saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace'. And it's an invitation that is extended to everyone, not just to people like me who are about to take holy orders.

And so it's with a humble and thankful heart that at the end of this month I will have the privilege of wearing a white cassock and stole, rather like the proverbial bride on her wedding day! And I will say 'I do' to God, not because I'm anything special, but because I long to share the grace and love of God that I have found with others. From there I will begin a life of service to God and the people of these Parishes as I serve my title in the High Westmorland Benefice. So, if you should happen upon someone who looks like a 'collared' curate in your community anytime soon, please stop and say "Hi, how's it going?"

Educational Grants: The Bampton Endowed Schools Endowment

Last year the Charity made 11 grants totalling £3,300 to local young people. These awards were mainly to help them financially while they took part in a variety of post-secondary school courses at college or university or while undertaking apprenticeships. The Trustees now invite applications for financial support from those who will be undertaking courses at any University, college or institution of higher or further education in autumn 2019. Consideration will also be given to applications from those who will be taking part in other forms of post-secondary education (including the study of music or other arts) to prepare for entry into any occupation, trade or profession.

To be eligible the applicant must be:

• Under the age of 25 on 1st September 2019

• Resident in the civil parish of Bampton, Cumbria or to have attended Bampton Endowed School.

Bampton CFR

Training has been going on as usual with the team learning about Dementia and its impact on patients, carers and their role as CFR's. North West Ambulance Service have also decided to give all CFR's a tympanic thermometer and a blood pressure machine to help with identification of patients at high risk of sepsis. Early identification is key and by escalating the incident appropriately the patient will receive the right care in line with national sepsis guidelines. Once these have been rolled out, Bampton CFR team will receive appropriate training before being able to use them with patients.

If you think you'd like to join the team and help provide essential emergency cover for the local community please feel free to get in contact with me for an informal chat or look at the NWAS CFR page <u>http://www.nwas-responders.info/ All applications</u> are submitted through the web page and are confidential.

If you feel unwell and think it is a medical emergency DIAL 999 or 112 and ask for AMBULANCE. Any on call CFR's will then be tasked by Ambulance control to attend if appropriate. CFR's will not be tasked to attend all 999 calls but will be asked to attend the following type of emergencies: abdominal pain, severe allergic reaction, breathing problems, fitting, diabetic emergency, chest pain, stroke, loss of consciousness, collapse, cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest, some trauma. We will not normally be tasked to any incident involving children under 12.
